

## TWEMLOW PARISH COUNCIL

**Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held at the at the Yellow Broom restaurant on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2019 at 7.30pm**

### **Declarations of Interest**

### **Public forum**

2 members of the public were welcomed

- Twemlow Lane is littered with straw and muck due to overhanging branches dislodging straw from large vehicles onto the Lane. **Action** – VM to address the matter with Streetscape
- Parked vehicles on Twemlow Lane continues to be a problem although it is accepted that they are not parked illegally. **Action** – VM to put a notice on Facebook and website asking residents to park considerately.

### **1/19 Minutes**

**Resolved:** The Parish Council resolved to accept the minutes of the meeting of the 6<sup>th</sup> November as a true record of the meeting and these were duly signed by the Chairman.

### **2/19 Matters arising from the minutes**

The Goostrey Lane kerb stone has been reported to CE Highways and a job number has been scheduled to look at this. **Action** – VM to chase this up

### **3/19 Speed watch**

There are no Speedwatch volunteer training sessions arranged at present by the PCSO due to the dark mornings, nights etc. **Action** – VM to chase PCSO for volunteer training session dates

More volunteers are needed **Action** – VM to advertise on Facebook for volunteers to come forward

### **4/19 Speeding on Twemlow Lane**

This continues to be an issue. VM read an email received from PCSO Liz Chesters with regards to enforcing the speed limit on Twemlow Lane. The email did not make sense. **Action** – VM to email Liz Chesters for clarification.

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2019 Cheshire Police carried out a speed gun session on the A535 outside the Yellow Broom and the highest speed recorded was 44mph. This was reported on Facebook. A member of the public commented on the post in a derogatory fashion with regards to the speed limits on Twemlow Lane. CB replied on behalf of TPC.

## **5/19 Highways**

### **RTA'S**

1<sup>st</sup> December 2019 – a vehicle collided with a pedestrian on the A535 Chelford Road between the Yellow Broom and Terra Nova School. Emergency services were in attendance but unfortunately the pedestrian dies at the scene.

11<sup>th</sup> January 2019 – A vehicle overshot the give way junction at Twemlow Lane/Twemlow Green and collided with a brick wall opposite. Emergency services were in attendance.

### **Twemlow Lane footpath resurfacing**

VM read an email received from Gillian Kidd, Senior Highways officer, regarding scheduling of the works. **Action** – VM to chase up the highways department for the 2019/2020 programme of works and if the resurfacing is not included to request a site visit.

### **12/19 Cheshire Archives**

Cheshire Archives have agreed to accept the records from TPC. The council agreed that records should be retained by the clerk for 7 years. **Action** – VM to catalogue and deliver records to the records office that pre-date 2012

**Resolved** – TPC agreed to the transfer of the paper records to Cheshire Archives pre-2012

### **13/19 Cheshire East matters**

Councilor Kolker reported as follows;

- A new roundabout is to be built in Holmes Chapel at the London Road/Chester Road junction. It is hoped this will be funded by 106 monies from the Gladman Development in the sum of .5 million pounds
- The Sibelo application has been approved however will be referred back to Cheshire East planning department for consideration of additional information
- There are concerns over the numbers of school places available in Holmes Chapel as a result of the influx of residents in the new build property. Holmes Chapel Comprehensive is at its peak and it is anticipated that by 2021 there will be a shortfall of 120 school places
- Connected communities are now up and running regularly and locally to discuss local issues which at present is focusing in social isolation, transport, sexual health and other local issues.

### **14/19 Chairman and members report**

CB would like the clerk to apply for a place at the Queens garden party if the deadline has not passed. **Action** – VM to consider application

CB has received a complaint regarding loose dogs on Twemlow Manor Fields. **Action** – VM to report the matter to the dog warden and Dane Housing

CB will speak to the Chronicle regarding their request to report on the removal of the personalized bricks from the viaduct

CB will be running a 10K race on the 24<sup>th</sup> March 2019 in aid of the Stroke Association. **Action** – VM to advertise link for donations on FB site

### **15/19 Clerks report**

Manchester Airport Group have offered 2 complimentary tickets to a volunteer in the village to watch the Halle in Manchester. **Action** – VM to apply for the tickets for WL.
